#### Exchange Program

**Available Period of Exchange Program:** Fall Semester (1 semester) or Fall Semester & Spring Semester 2027 (2 semesters)

**Nomination Period:** February 2 ~ March 31

**Nomination Procedures:** Before students can apply for an exchange program at OIDAI, they must be officially nominated by their home institutions and remain enrolled at their home institutions until the end of the semester; students who graduate or withdraw during the semester are not eligible for exchange student status. This nomination should be completed by the program coordinator at the affiliated university — NOT by the students themselves, by filling out the form linked below.

The form will ask for the following information:

- Student's full name
- Student's email address
- Date of birth
- Gender
- Nationality
- Course of study at the home institution
- Month/Year of enrollment

- Expected Month/Year of graduation
- Japanese language proficiency level
- Health condition
- Number of semester(s) the student plans to attend OIDA
- Preferred accommodation (Dormitory, Apartment or Homestay)

Please note: It is essential that this form is submitted by the university coordinator. Students must first be screened and officially nominated by their home universities before they can proceed with the application process.

As part of the nomination process for exchange students to our university, we kindly ask our partner institutions to take the following actions to ensure a smooth and safe experience for all students:

***Health Check and Notification (in Nomination)***

Please conduct a thorough confirmation with the nominated students regarding their health conditions. If there are any concerns or issues, kindly notify us at the time of nomination.

***Accurate Completion of the Medical Certificate (in Application)***

Ensure that the nominated students are instructed to complete the medical certificate included in the application process with accurate and comprehensive information, without omitting any details.

OIDA considers the safety of students during travel and their ability to lead a healthy and stable life while studying abroad to be essential prerequisites for receiving exchange students. Thus, OIDA requires health confirmations as part of the nomination and application processes. This allows us to preemptively review measures to ensure their safety and well-being. Where necessary, we aim to establish a shared understanding with the partner institution and the student to provide the most appropriate support during their stay.

<b>Extra-Curriculum</b>	Japanese Language Courses: (Non-Credit-bearing)	Three levels of courses are prepared, and attentive instruction is provided in small classes from Beginner, Elementary through Intermediate. Classes are conducted daily on weekdays with 127.75 hours of instruction per semester for each level.

## Housing (Off-campus Only)

**Dormitory:** Offers a fully-furnished room with breakfast and dinner served daily except for Sundays and national holidays.

**Apartment:** The rooms are fully furnished and equipped with a bathroom, kitchen, refrigerator, microwave, washing machine, air conditioner, study desk, bed, and internet.

**Homestay:** A room with a desk and bedding will be supplied for you. The homestay fee includes two meals a day. You will be able to keep your living expenses down and have a comfortable stay in Japan.

\*Rooms are limited. There is no guarantee that your request is confirmed.

#### Other Information

**Transcripts + Certificates:** Transcripts and Certificates will be sent to the home institution after the last semester of the student's exchange ends. The transcripts will be sent out in the following periods:

Spring semester	Early October
Fall semester	Early April

**Insurance:** All exchange students are recommended to be covered by insurance from the time you leave your country until the orientation when they will participate in/purchase the National Health Insurance and the Comprehensive Insurance for Student Lives. Schedule including the orientation date will be advised after admission.
